## 1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

The college has well planned curriculum , it is published in the form of prospectus every year and distributed among students faculties and staff members. The prospectus comprises vision and mission of the college as well as various facilities available in the college. It does also include various committees working in different field, so in the beginning of the session the students were well aquatinted with faculties and facilities. The students were encouraged to take part in co-curricular activities like sports NCC, NSS and cultural events throughout the years. There is one unit of NCC (Army Wing) & one N.C.C. (Naval Wing) comprise of 160 students admitted in First year. There is also one unit of NSS that include 80 students. The carrier guidance cell of the college organizes entrepreneurship and placements drive for final year students. This cell also conducted time to time lectures for preparation of various competitive exams. In the beginning of the session, in the month of July there is one week orientation\Zero classes were conducted for students so that they get awareness scheme about the various schemes. There is separate admission committee for every year, the convener of this committee perform the role of mentor for respective classes and solves the problems of students throughout the year and guide them in proper manners. In the beginning of the session the college designs a time table for various departments which walled up at various places of the college. The regular staff council meetings were organized to discuss the various qualities Initiative. The college has well organized system to provide scholarships to SC\ST\OBC students as per the governments rule. The Provision of scholarships of female \male general brighter students as "Gaon ki Beti" and "Prativakiran yojana" and for male there is "Vikramaditya Yojana". Two new Scholarship schemes were introduced Mukhayamantri medhavi vidyarthi & Mukhyamantri jan kalyan schemesThe college has well stabilized library it provide study materials to the students on regular bases. The book bank scheme is available to provide books and stationary to students of SC/ST categories
